FROM PASTOR JOHN

A few months ago, I took my grandson to the Connecticut Science Center in downtown Hartford, where we were fascinated by an exhibit depicting a historic flood on the nearby Connecticut River. After our water-logged February and March, 2024, museum curators may soon be adding to that exhibit!

I trust most of you have heard about the recent and repeated flooding in our church basement, which has damaged floors, walls, and the contents of classrooms and storage spaces. Our Trustees have responded marvelously to this crisis, calling in companies to pump out water and remove damaged materials, and conferring with town of Wethersfield officials and insurance companies. Some of our Trustees have also spent countless hours doing hands-on damage control. After last week's basement flooding (3 inches!), *Gary Schaffrick, Bruce Bockstael*, and *Russ Sinisi* were in the building very early in the morning to deal with the situation. We cannot thank them enough for their labor of love!

The good news is that the repetitive flooding does not appear to be the fault of our own building infrastructure. The issue is external, in city water and sewage systems that have been strained beyond their capacity. While those issues are being addressed, the Trustees are doing everything they can to make our basement as watertight as possible. Next week, the church building will be closed from 6:00 AM to 12:00 noon so ongoing work can be done. Our Office Administrator, *Karen Rudewicz*, will continue to work from home as she has this week. It goes without saying that possible renovations and modifications of the basement space are on hold until the flooding problem has been resolved. For the sake of your safety and health, please refrain from going downstairs until these repair projects are completed. Thank you!

A Battle for Methodism – Faith and Perseverance

Soon after the Rev. William Pease began preaching in the Academy Building as a circuit rider, the First Quarterly Conference was held in a grove. These details were written in a historical sketch by the Rev. Albert H. Nash in 1877:

"Nearby was a tannery and the enemy improved the opportunity by hanging sheepskins on fences conveniently near the grove. So dire was the stench that the conference adjourned perforce to a barn in the vicinity. Petty annoyances of this character seem to have been frequent and long continued, making the town a battlefield for Methodism from the very beginning."

In 1882, the Rev. George L. Colburn wrote the following in his Brief Historical Sketch of the Wethersfield M.E. Church:

"Some of the leading men of the town no doubt thought they were doing God's service by resisting what might have seemed to them a pernicious innovation of the established creed of the State. The spirit of prejudice which prevailed so largely throughout New England was aroused, and the spirit of intolerance which had driven the pilgrims from their homes beyond the sea, to the wilds of an unsettled country, to find a home on the inhospitable shores of the new world revived again, and Methodism found itself innocently arrayed against the established church of New England, and those who dared to announce the doctrines of atonement and full salvation through faith in the Son of God, were met with the fires of persecution, as far as petty annoyances and social ostracism could be employed, and when these failed to accomplish their end, personal violence was not infrequently the result."

This local faith community never the less persevered and grew in number. On September 29, 1821, the Second Quarterly Conference selected a committee to secure land to build our first church. Rev. Colburn wrote that local opposition made this difficult, so Charles Winslow purchased a quarter-acre plot, with a dwelling, and two days after, sold it to the Methodist Society.

These original handwritten histories authored by Rev. Nash and Rev. Colburn are precious documents in our WUMC history artifacts, as well as the record of conferences as far back as 1821. Please contact Grace Hayes if you wish to view these pieces of history. Additionally, they will be displayed at our Homecoming Sunday celebration on September 15.
