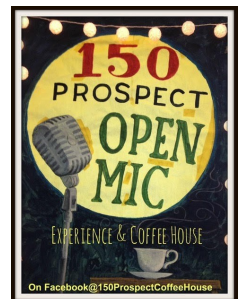

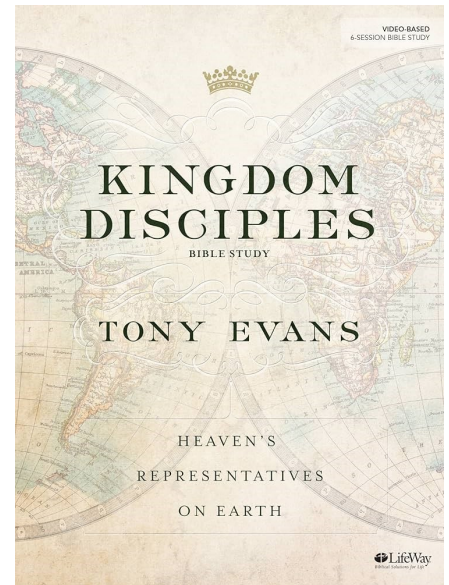
WORDLY WOMEN BIBLE STUDY
